

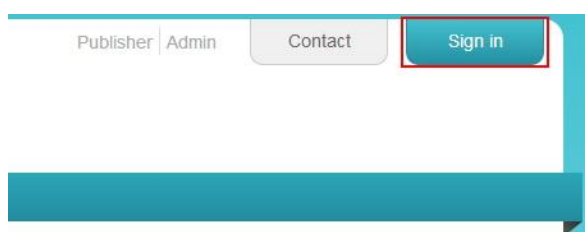
Basic User Guide: Dawsonera

Get access to hundreds of study guides and past papers via our Dawsonera e-book collection.

Type in the following URL into your web browser to get to the Dawsonera website.

Once you have arrived at the site look for the "Sign In" button.



Click on this button to sign in.

1. Your Aberdeenshire Libraries borrower number.
2. The password: Aberdeenshire1

3. If prompted take a note of the number or character generated in “Captcha”.
4. Input this number or character here within the “Captcha” window.
5. Finally, click on the “Login” button.
Once you login to the system you will be prompted read and accept the terms and conditions.

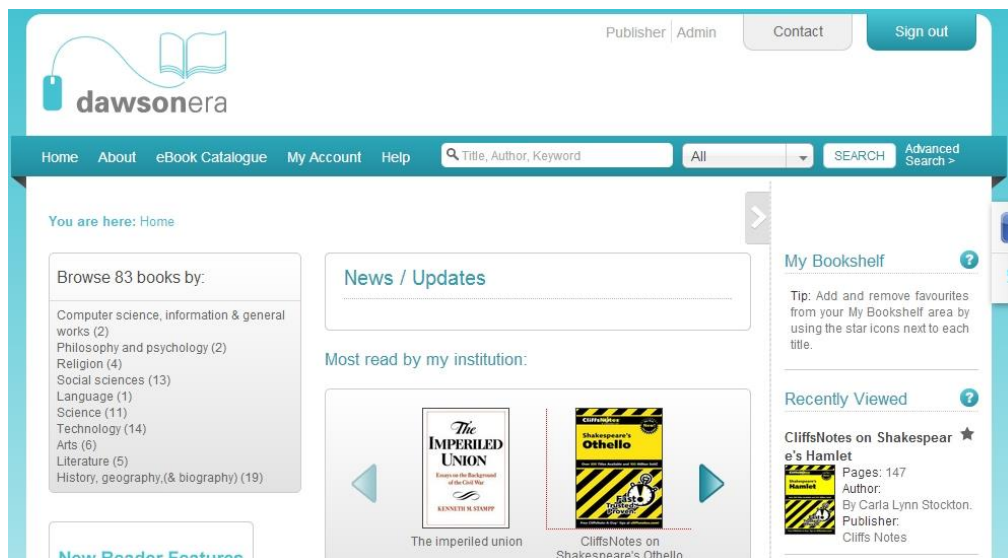

Please click 'Accept' to indicate that you have read and understood the following terms and conditions:

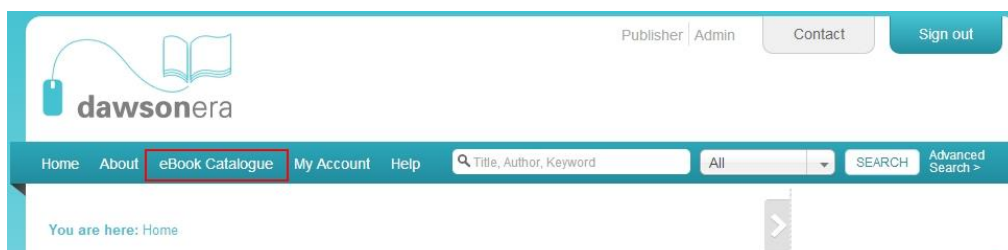
You will find the “Accept” button at the bottom of the screen.

The section in red gives you the option to download the ebook or reader in the browser.

Download will give you the option to save the book to your device for 1 or two days. (You will require Adobe Reader to read the e-book, don't worry it's free to install from the link shown below)

You may download an electronic version of this book for reading offline or on another device. Like a traditional library eBooks are loaned to you for a number of days. After this period has expired you will no longer be able to read the book until you download it again.

Once you have selected the length of loan you can click on the "Download" button. (Don't worry about the e-book expiring after two days... you can go back and borrow it again as and when required.)

You can also choose to read the book in your web browser.

 - Claudius** (King of Denmark; marries his sister-in-law and ascends to throne after death of King Hamlet) is the brother and murderer of King Hamlet's Ghost, the husband of Gertrude, and the advisor to **Polonius**.
 - Polonius** (Claudius' Counselor) is the father of **Laertes** and the uncle of **Hamlet**.
 - Laertes** (returns from France to avenge Polonius' death and conspires with Claudius to kill Hamlet) is the brother of Polonius and the father of **Ophelia**.
 - Hamlet** (Prince of Denmark; seeks to avenge his father's death) is the son of Gertrude and the nephew of Polonius.
 - Ophelia** is the daughter of Laertes and the sister of Hamlet.

Once the book has loaded in the browser you can choose to download the book (1), copy text (2), print up to 70% of the book content (3) and flick through the books pages (4).
